Successful completion of this course will allow youth under the age of 16 to legally operate tractors or self- propelled implements on public roads. Completing the safety program will also allow youth age 14 or 15 to work on a farm other than one owned by their parents, and operate tractors and other machinery.

Interested youth must pre-register prior to June 16 by contacting the Spooner Ag Agents Office at 715-635-3506 or 1-800-528-1914, and provide their name, age, address, telephone number and social security number. A signed waiver form is also required to participate in the training. The hours of the course will be from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm. Students must be at least 12 years old to enroll in the program and attendance at all three days' training is required for certification. Cost of the course is \$20.00.
