Farm Bureau's Dairy Breakfast - Will be held on Saturday June 23rd, 2018 at the Sawyer County Fairgrounds, from 6:30AM until 11:00AM. Volunteers are needed to serve extra pancakes, replenish syrup and butter on tables, clean off and wipe tables, and helping with clean up at the end of the breakfast. There are 2 shifts available to work; from 7:00AM until 9:00AM and then from 9:00AM until 11:30AM. Educational Fair - Will be held at the Fairgrounds Tuesday, August 7th from 8AM – Noon. Wednesday, August 8th from 8:00AM until finished (1:00-2:00ish). Workers are needed on Tuesday to help sort projects into correct age group and category. On Wednesday, workers will help put stickers on projects after judging and help to hang up projects to be displayed for fair.

Sawyer County Fair - Held at the Fairgrounds August 23rd-26th. Various jobs are available to help out in all areas. On Thursday, people are needed to attach ribbons to projects after judging and to help display projects.

Ice Cream Booth - Held at the Fairgrounds August 23rd-26th. This is the **majo**r fundraiser for our Sawyer County's 4-H program. Two hour shifts are available all 4 days (signup to come). Duties include scooping ice cream cones, making floats, malts, and sundaes, taking customer orders, and helping with cleanup and stocking of items.

MASC- Sheep, Goat and Swine Weigh-In Saturday, April 21st 2018

Stone Lake Fire Hall at 9:30am.

Meeting and weigh-in held at the Stone Lake Fire Hall at 9:30am.

Three Lambs and two goats were weighed in. There will be 8-9 swine this year, they will be tagged at the final weigh-in. It is suggested that youth and their families weigh swine on their own to help with rate of gain calculations and to have completed books for the fair.

Discussion was had regarding terminal fair for swine. This guidance comes to Sawyer County MASC from the Leaders/Fair Board. All families were informed of this requirement for this year's fair, no action needed.

Sale flyer- Joey Johnson and Rhandi Lynn Ehn will be working on the flyer this year. Will set up a time beginning of June to visit each farm, take photos of the youth with their animals and do their write ups. We will have the brochures printed as soon as possible following the 4th of July, Sawyer County Gazette Prints these for MASC so it has been their request to wait and print them after the July Jubilee celebration in Winter.

A staging area has been recommended by last year's judge at the fair and MASC has made it a priority to set up a staging area prior to this year's show and auction. Money from the NW Walleye's tournament of approx. \$350 can go toward these improvements. A meeting will be set up in the near future to meet at the fair grounds and discuss what can be done to accommodate a staging area for each type of animal.

Conrath Meats has committed to being this year's butcher and will hold the carcass show the Wednesday following the auction. Time of the carcass show will be determined.

Future meeting date is TBD. Meeting adjourned at 10:30am.

MASC - Swine project - Discussion regarding viral epidemic that affect swine - no reports have been reported in WI. Discussion about test for virus and expense of testing. Weigh in is April 21 for sheep and goats only, but all MASC invited and will discuss swine entries and options. MASC will not be weighing pigs based on vet suggestion, but will discuss other options to ensure fairness and accurate pig entries. Termination fair for any pigs entered, including open class is a possibility for this year. More info will follow after discussion and member decision on April 21

Horse project - Declarations due May 1st - all coggins and vaccinations need to be completed by that time, and all horses intended to be used at the fair need to be declared. Declaration pages need to be turned in to the UW-extension office.

Old Business:

Record book updates - updates made to online project pages. Reflections Page taken from Horse Project Pages and implemented to other projects so that members are better able to communicate and reflect on their year in the project. Only other change to pages includes a minor change to the grading scale to ensure more continuity among club leaders when grading.

New Business:

-Summer Camp - July 10th-12th Lori B working with Rusk county to make plans. Volunteers needed for counselors.

-Dairy Breakfast - Saturday, June 23rd volunteers, typically from horse project, needed from 6:30-11:30 Donna will follow up with MOU with Farm Bureau

-Fair booklet update - Deb made changes to art category, specifically Legos entry. Changes made to count entries per grade level. Category added for "any other" to include other projects or challenges that would include a booklet/scrap book, etc. Photography category changed to group animal entries together, and bird entries together.
