
4-H CALENDAR OF OPPORTUNITIES

Reminder: <u>All new & returning</u> <u>members/volunteers/leaders need to enroll</u> <u>through 4-H online each year.</u>

Getting started

To get started with the re-enrollment process, log into 4HOnline (http://wi.4honline.com) with your family email and password. (Contact the Sawyer County Extension office if you can't remember your password). To access the system, use Google, Firefox or Mozilla....<u>Internet</u> <u>Explorer will NOT access the system</u>.

On the family home screen, click on the orange button labeled Continue to Family.

On your Member/Volunteer list, find the family member you wish to re-enroll and click on Edit next to their name.

Re-enroll

At the bottom of the next screen, click on the button for Enroll for 2018-2019.

If the youth is over 17 years old, a box will appear asking if you wish to enroll as a youth or an adult. If the youth is graduating from 4-H and wants to continue as an adult leader, then choose Enroll As Adult, otherwise select Enroll as Youth.

You will now see the Personal Information that you entered when you first enrolled. Look over the information and make any corrections. If the youth was in 12th grade last year, you must select the grade for this year, either Post High School Education or Not in School. When you are done, click on Continue.

Next is the Additional Information screen where you will need to accept the agreements and answer the Photo Release and Accommodations questions. Click Continue when done.

The Health Form for members is optional at enrollment, but you could be asked to complete it

in the future if you attend any events that require one. Click Continue when done.

If you are an adult volunteer and see the Volunteer Screening page, then it has been 4 years since the last time a background check has been completed. You need to check over the answers to the questions and correct as needed. This page will only appear every 4 years. Click Continue when done.

On the Participation -> Club screen, confirm the correct club is listed. If you serve in a volunteer role (but not as a project leader) click on Edit and select the volunteer type. Click on Update to save the change. Click on Continue when done.

On the Participation -> Projects screen, confirm all the projects you are enrolled in are listed. Add any missing projects. If you are dropping a project, click on Edit for that project and then click on Delete. After making sure all your projects are listed correctly, click on Submit Enrollment.

YQCA Training for Members in Animal Projects

Starting fall of 2018, Wisconsin will replace the MAQA (Meat Animal Quality Assurance) program with the Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) national program. This new and interactive program provides youth a number of options for an annual quality assurance certification. YQCA was created for youth in the Beef, Dairy, Goat, Poultry, Rabbit, Sheep, and Swine projects. This new program gives families more flexibility in acquiring this much needed information which trains youth in improving the care of food animals and promoting a higher level of consumer food safety. The livestock industry and businesses are constantly striving for high quality, wholesome products; therefore, youth in food animal projects should assist in this effort.


Sawyer County 4-H clubs is excited to announce we will offer the on-line version of the YQCA national program this year.

To enroll:

Please go to <u>https://yqca.learngrow.io/Account/Login</u> in order to register for either online or instructor led courses. If you are a 4-H member, please log in through the 4-H Online system on the left. If you are an FFA member or other organization affiliate, please sign in through the independent system on the right. You will create an account followed by either completing a sign up for an <u>instructor led meeting</u> or <u>online/web based</u> modules. Upon signing up for a course, you will then pay for that course with a credit card. Please email <u>help@yqca.org</u> for any assistance you need in creating or signing up in the YQCA system.

Of reminder, Wisconsin State Fair and other national exhibitions will require certification in YQCA for participation for 2018 events and beyond. Wisconsin State Fair will be in contact sometime in January.

Horsehair Bracelet

These bracelets are made with a four-part braid and black hair from Martha's horses. For another horsehair craft, try our Horsehair Tassel.

TOOLS AND MATERIALS

Horsehair

Waxed twine Jewelry findings Glue cement Pliers

- 1. Follow braiding instructions. Braid a long section of horsehair, and tie tightly with twine at ends, every 6 to 8 inches.
- 2. Cut between 2 ties to create the pieces for your bracelet.

3. Dab glue cement onto both snipped ends of horsehair and inside the end caps. Insert hair into blackened end caps.

4. Use pliers to attach a jump ring to each end cap before attaching the clasp.

Note: I used metal blackener on our brass and silver findings. Follow manufacturer's instructions.

Horsehair Tassel

This tassel -- and our Horsehair Bracelet -- are great gifts to make in bulk for all your stylish friends.

TOOLS AND MATERIALS

Horsehair Waxed twine Leather trim Clear glue



- 1. Start with 12 inches of horsehair. Take a grouping of hair, and tie tightly at center point with waxed twine.
- 2. Fold hair in half, and tie off tightly about 1 1/2 inches down from the fold. Remove hairs that have escaped.
- 3. Trim tassel to desired length.
- 4. Cover the waxed twine around body of tassel with a piece of leather trim. Dab glue to secure as you wrap.
- 5. Stitch the trim closed.
- 6. To finish, add a leather tie to the top of the tassel.
