Northwest Cleansweep will accept the first 200 lbs. of chemicals from farmers or abandoned farms for free. Farmers with agricultural related wastes can participate at any of the household hazardous waste collection events or at the permanent collection site in Spooner. **Pre-registration is required Call 715/635-2197** contain heavy metals and mercury that can contaminate rivers, lakes and fish if not properly disposed. Bring the following items from your home to one of our household hazardous waste collections so they can be recycled or managed properly:

- Lead Tackle
- Split Shot/Weights
- Mercury batteries
- Button batteries
- Thermostats and switches
- Fluorescent and HID lamps
- Some types of old paint
- Liquid mercury.
- Thermometers
