DIY

What You Need:

- 4 pool noodles
- Duct tape
- Scissors
- Skewer or ice pick
- String
- Hose

What to Do:

1. Choose the location where you can tie up the sprinkler once it is made. You will want a tree limb or poles that you can attach the sprinkler to with string/twine. The sprinkler will need to be attached about 6 feet from the ground. Before you add the water, the sprinkler should set about 6–8 inches above the ground, as the water weight will weigh the sprinkler down and let it set flush with the ground.
 2. Connect all 4 pool noodles, taping securely with duct tape. Make the tape taut so there will be no leaks.
 3. Poke holes, using a skewer, into the inside curved area of each noodle. You will get more spray if holes are concentrated facing the center of your sprinkler. Be sure to NOT poke through to the outside of the noodles.
 4. With scissors, or small knife, cut a small opening into the top of your sprinkler. Remember that the hose needs to fit snugly, so make the opening smaller than the end of the hose.
 5. Attach the sprinkler to tree limb or pole with string/ twine. Insert hose and tape securely in position.
 6. Turn on the hose and have a ton of fun!!
- ** If you have a hose that has a on/off valve right located about an inch from the end you are attaching to the sprinkler, it makes it easier to turn the water sprinkler on and off at will.

Who: All 4-H members in the State of Wisconsin

What: Develop and name an ice cream flavor

When: Entries must be submitted to Cedar Crest Ice Cream no later than October 1, 2019, via the online entry form or email.

How: Submit entries using the online form. [Or you can use the entry form on the next page.] Forms can be emailed to kaitlyn.mazza@cedarcresticecream.com.

We encourage you to include high-resolution photos (cell phone or digital camera), drawings or stories about the development of your flavor with your entry; however, it is not required. Cedar Crest and 4-H Foundation may use these items for promotional purposes. Please email to: kaitlyn.mazza@cedarcresticecream.com or use the File Upload option on the online form.

We will select five top finalists with one finalist chosen as the grand prize winner.

The grand prize winner will receive a Cedar Crest Ice Cream Party and a \$300 prize. The winning flavor will also be produced in 2020 and featured on all materials announcing the 2020 Feature Flavor line-up for the year.

The 4 additional top finalists will receive a Cedar Crest Ice Cream Party.

Some past feature flavors include:

- Superior Shores - Vanilla Ice Cream with Chocolate Rocks and a Wave of Blueberry and Raspberry Fruit Swirls
- Big Muddy – Dark Chocolate flavored Ice Cream with a Caramel Swirl and Brownie pieces

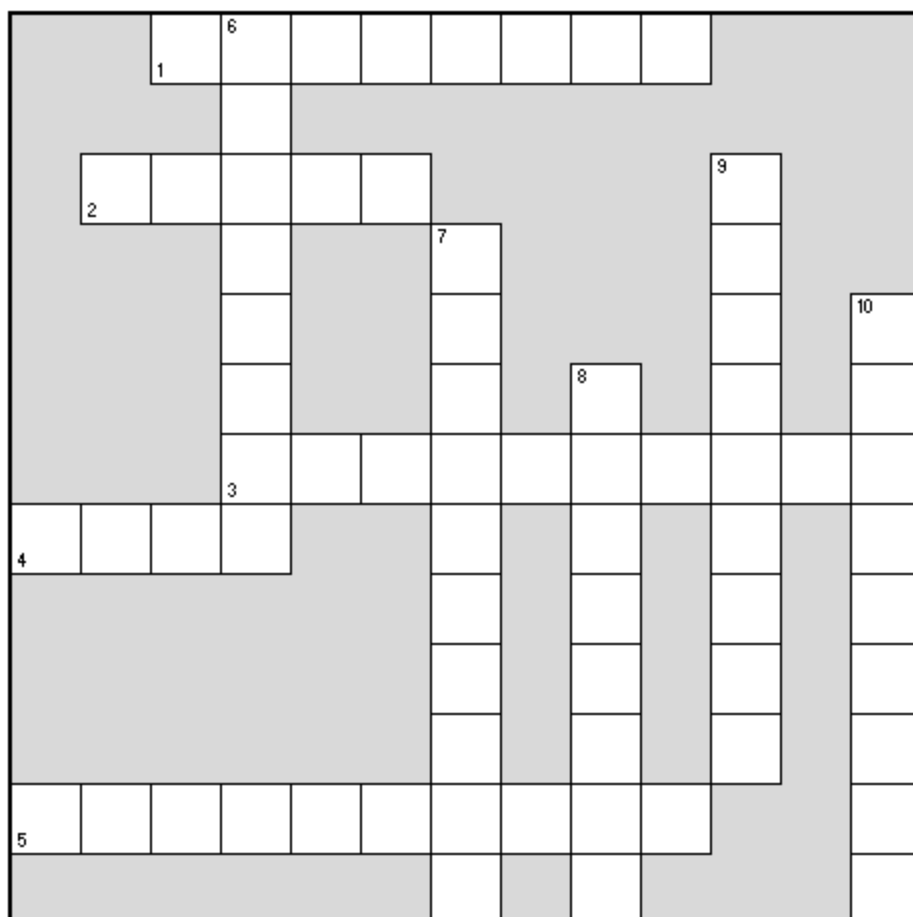
