
REMINDER

- Be able to attend a student meeting on Monday,
 January 20th from 5:30 PM-7 PM in Birchwood.
- Be available to attend a preparatory training at Birchwood School on Wednesday, January 29th at 5:30 PM -7 PM.
- Be available to attend all day trip to the state capital in Madison on Thursday, February 6, 2019 (bus typically leaves Rice Lake at 6 am and arrives back in Rice Lake at 10 pm)

2020 Educational Programs Adult Advisor Applications Now Available

Adult Advisors

2020 Applications are now open through February 15, 2020 in 4HOnline. Apply today!

Apply today for an adult advisor position with Wisconsin 4-H! Adult advisors travel to many different cities across the United States with youth participants to serve as mentors, guides, and support for the youth on the programs. Adults are responsible for the well being of all youth participants and must work as a team to ensure that an experience runs smoothly. You can find out more about being an adult advisor below.

What opportunities exist?

- Citizenship Washington Focus in Washington, D.C. (June-July);
- National 4-H Congress in Atlanta, Georgia (late November);
- Space Camp in Huntsville, Alabama (late April);
- American Spirit Experience East (Early June or July);
- Wisconsin 4-H & Youth Conference (Late June);
- International immersion programs in Costa Rica, Japan, Finland, South Korea (4 weeks, summer 2019);
- Other Educational Programs that are under development.

Who can apply?

- Applicants must be at least 21 years old (25 for some experiences) at time of program.
- Applicants must have completed the Wisconsin 4-H VIP Training and currently be registered as 4-H leaders.

What are the expectations of Adult Advisors?

- Applicants must be in good physical condition to withstand rigors associated with the program. Expect much walking on hard surfaces, handling luggage, and sharing a sleeping room. Sleep deficit is common.
- Space Camp, Citizenship Washington Focus (CWF), and American Spirit Experience leaders can expect long bus rides.
- CWF participants usually experience high temperatures with humidity in Washington D.C.
- Public speaking is required.
- Adult leaders must work cooperatively with fellow Adult Advisor Team Members and remain with the delegation at all times during the program.
- Adult leaders are required to submit a report and evaluation upon completion of the program.
- Participation at scheduled teleconference or in-person orientations is mandatory.

Interested volunteers can go through the event registration portal in 4HOnline to apply to be an adult advisor for the following programs: Space Camp, CWF, American Spirit, and National 4-H Congress. DISTRICT 27-E1 YOUTH SERVICE PROJECT AWARD 2019

The Lions and Lioness Clubs of District 27-E1 are sponsoring a Youth Service Project Award program to recognize and encourage service learning in our Northwest Wisconsin area. This program is meant to be promoted by local Lions and Leo Clubs of District 27-E1.

Local clubs are encouraged to identify service activities carried out by school or youth groups. Examples include Leo Clubs, church groups, 4-H Clubs, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, school organizations, Boys and Girls Clubs, and other similar youth volunteer organizations. Lion and Lioness Clubs may choose to sponsor a local area contest of their own design. Each Lion and Lioness Club may select a nominee to be entered into the District Contest. A Leo Club may nominate itself for the District Contest.

The District Winners will be selected by a team of judges headed by the Youth Activities Chair and at least two members of the District Cabinet. The District Winners will be recognized during the District 27-E1 Convention in Superior, on March 30,2019.


This application form is not intended to be lengthy and should not take an inordinate time to complete. Please keep the required parts of the application simple and brief. The required portion of the application form consists of the following three steps:

- Step 1. Fill out the cover page of the the APPLICATION FORM and ENDORSEMENT completely. Have the form signed as requested.
- Step 2. Write brief narrative answers to the three questions that appear on the following pages. The questions are designed to help the reader comprehend the service project's goals, its execution, and its impact on the community.
- Step 3. Provide observations/reflections by the students/members about their involvement in the service project. Include comments from at least three group members.


Providing additional information and documentation is optional. Examples of additional documentation are pictures, local news articles, a letter of support from the group advisor, and comments from anyone who is affected by the project. Other supporting documents or evidence are possible. However, do not forward electronic disks or other electronic media with the application.











National 4-H Congress




