The 4-H annual awards trip

The annual 4-H Fall Awards trip was held on Saturday, September 7th. It was a nice day and the rain held off. Seven 4-Hers and 5 adults ventured over to the Twin Cities area to visit Como Zoo in the morning and Fort Snelling in the afternoon. At Como Zoo, we saw lions, tigers and (polar) bears, oh my! There were gorillas, giraffes, zebras and many other neat animals as well.

I asked the youth on the bus on the way back about their favorite parts of the day:

Gwendolyn: I liked the tiger and the polar bear at the zoo, and the blacksmith shop at the fort.

Gunnar: I liked the tiger getting fed the bone and the cannons and muskets at the fort.

Rowan: The Como Zoo was very cool because I like seeing how the animals adapt based on their environment. I liked learning about the past and seeing a blacksmith work at the fort.

Sydney Holly: I loved seeing all the baby animals at Como Zoo. I also really liked seeing all the old artifacts that were found at Fort Snelling.

Samantha Kennell: I enjoyed seeing all of the baby animals including the zebra foal, the gorilla baby, and the baby giraffe. I also loved seeing the flamingos. My favorite part about Fort Snelling was being able to walk in and touch most of the exhibits.

Fort Snelling is an 1820's era fort perched on the banks of the junction of the Minnesota and Mississippi rivers. We could wander around the grounds and check out the different buildings, like the colonel's house, soldiers bunkhouse, the kitchens, and the working blacksmith shop. It was interesting to see that the blacksmith working that day was a woman. Some of the staff wore period costumes and demonstrated the firing of the cannon and muskets, and showed marching drills on the parade grounds. It was a very enjoyable trip.





The sawyer county fair offered a 4-H family fun night. It was a great way for all of our members to bond and get to know one another. We enjoyed a dinner, ice breakers, a movie and a fun piñata! I think everyone is looking forward to the next 4-H fun event!

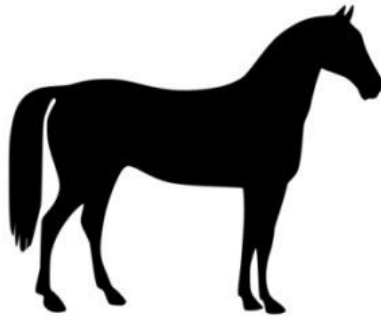

- Be a Junior or Senior in a High School located in Barron, Rusk, Sawyer or Washburn Counties or attend WITC or UWEC-BC.
- Be able to attend a student meeting on Monday, January 20th from 5:30 PM-7 PM in Birchwood.
- Be available to attend a preparatory training at Birchwood School on Wednesday, January 29th at 5:30 PM -7 PM.
- Be available to attend all day trip to the state capital in Madison on Thursday, February 6, 2019 (bus typically leaves Rice Lake at 6 am and arrives back in Rice Lake at 10 pm)

Cost:

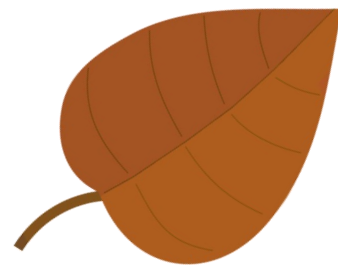
- \$90 registration fee per person - Friday – Sunday (pizza buffet, 3 meals Saturday, 1 meal Sunday)
- \$80 registration fee per person - Saturday – Sunday (3 meals Saturday, 1 meal Sunday)
- \$75 registration fee - Saturday – (lunch and Hall of Fame dinner)
- \$55 registration fee - Saturday – (lunch only)

- Lodging:
 - o Adults ▪ \$50/night if there are two adults
 - \$80/night for single adult room (limited availability)
 - \$40/night with three or more adults per room

o Youth ▪ \$35/night with three to six youth per room

The program kicks off Friday evening with over 15 interactive sessions. Saturday offers more than 25 workshops to choose from. Top off the night with a special celebration where 5 laureates will be inducted in to the Wisconsin 4-H Hall of Fame. An evening of circle dancing and table games will follow the celebration. Sunday morning brings a high energy program that you can use at the club or community level.

All youth participants need to have a chaperon who has completed Youth Protection identified when they register.

What is National 4-H Congress?



National 4-H Congress is a five-day Educational Experience held in Atlanta, GA. Congress is the premiere nation-wide event for 4-Hers to network with others from around the country, Canada, and Puerto Rico. While at Congress, 4-Hers engage in leadership, citizenship, global awareness, and inclusion. Here are just some of the activities delegates will partake in while at National Congress:

- **Educational Workshops:** Varying from sessions like “Farm to Fork-Teaching as Service Learning,” “Dancing with the Stars,” “Social Media in Our World,” and “The Healthy Gourmet,” there’s bound to be a state-of-the-art workshop for everyone!
- **Exploring the city:** With educational trips to museums, theaters, and Centennial Olympic park, delegates will get to broaden their appreciation for the arts and many historical events in America.
- **State and Congress-wide meetings:** Delegates will be given time to reflect on their recent experiences as well as put their new skills to use!
- **International Events:** Let’s take a trip overseas! With a night of international dinner and entertainment, delegates will expand their knowledge on the culture, food, and art of countries from around the globe!
- **Community Service:** Delegates will be split up to serve various parts of downtown Atlanta to give back and experience what it feels like to have a positive impact on a community!
- **Educational Tours:** Whether delegates are learning about the hottest attractions in “Hotlanta,” exploring the CNN News Worldwide Headquarters, learning about the historical events of the south, visiting the College Football Hall of Fame, walking around the aquarium or exploring the zoo, delegates will get a little taste of what there is to experience in Atlanta!
- **World-Renowned Speakers:** In previous years, delegates have heard from Miss America, top-ranked motivational speakers, Miss Delaware and alopecia areata hair loss patient, and holocaust survivors.

National 4-H Congress Gala: To close out the experience, delegates will have a formal dinner and ceremony with some special guest appearances

FYI

All new and returning members/volunteers/leaders need to enroll through 4-H online each year.

Getting started

To get started with the re-enrollment process, log into 4HOnline (<http://wi.4honline.com>) with your family email and password. (Contact the Sawyer County Extension office if you can't remember your password). To access the system, use Google, Firefox or Mozilla....Internet Explorer will NOT access the system.

On the family home screen, click on the orange button labeled Continue to Family.

On your Member/Volunteer list, find the family member you wish to re-enroll and click on Edit next to their name.

Re-enroll

At the bottom of the next screen, click on the button for Enroll for 2019-2020.

If the youth is over 17 years old, a box will appear asking if you wish to enroll as a youth or an adult. If the youth is graduating from 4-H and wants to continue as an adult leader, then choose Enroll As Adult, otherwise select Enroll as Youth.

You will now see the Personal Information that you entered when you first enrolled. Look over the information and make any corrections. If the youth was in 12th grade last year, you must select the grade for this year, either Post High School Education or Not in School. When you are done, click on Continue.

Next is the Additional Information screen where you will need to accept the agreements and answer the Photo Release and Accommodations questions. Click Continue when done.

The Health Form for members is optional at enrollment, but you could be asked to complete it in the future if you attend any events that require one. Click Continue when done.

If you are an adult volunteer and see the Volunteer Screening page, then it has been 4 years since the last time a background check has been completed. You need to check over the answers to the questions and correct as needed. This page will only appear every 4 years. Click Continue when done.

On the Participation -> Club screen, confirm the correct club is listed. If you serve in a volunteer role (but not as a project leader) click on Edit and select the volunteer type. Click on Update to save the change. Click on Continue when done.

On the Participation -> Projects screen, confirm all the projects you are enrolled in are listed. Add any missing projects. If you are dropping a project, click on Edit for that project and then click on Delete. After making sure all your projects are listed correctly, click on Submit Enrollment.
